General Information

Check-In

Check-in for camp is 8:00-8:45 am on Tuesday, June 9.

Health and Insurance

The costs for the treatment of injuries and hospitalization for illness or injuries incurred during the Sports Camps will be the responsibility of the parent or guardian of the participant. A medical form will be sent with a confirmation letter. The medical form must be on file to participate, no exceptions. School physicals along with the camp medical form signed by parent/guardian may be used if the physical is within one year of the beginning of camp.

Rules and Regulations

All individuals enrolled are required to comply with the rules and regulations of The University of Iowa Sports Camps. Any violation of these rules may cause immediate dismissal from the camp.



Facilities

Pearl Field is one of the finest in the country, having hosted eight NCAA regional tournaments and two Big Ten tournaments. The field was completely renovated following the flood of 2008 to include new state-of-the-art locker rooms, Iowa team room, concession and restroom areas, batting cages, and bullpens. Hilltopper infield surface was also added, creating an essentially waterproof infield. In addition to Pearl Field, the Hawkeye Softball Complex consists of three enclosed recreation fields with agrilime infields. Campers will get to practice and play on each field and have access to batting cages, pulpens, and all equipment used by the Hawkeye softball team.

In case of inclement weather, campers will use the Indoor Practice Facility (Bubble) or the Upper Finkbine Field (former Grant Field).

Costs and Cancellations

The three-day camp is \$175 while one day (your choice) is \$90. Written requests for refunds must be submitted to: UI Sports Camps Office, 203 Field House, Iowa City, Iowa 52242-1111. Campers who must leave during the week due to illness or injury will receive a prorated refund. Requests for refunds must be made prior to August 15.

Camp Objective

The Iowa Softball Day Camp offers the best in individual instruction for every girl participating in camp. Special emphasis is on the development of sound fundamental skills in the game of fastpitch. Our goal is to have each girl leave camp with a better command of the game as well as a better understanding of what it takes to be a team player.

Softball players from 8 to 17 years of age (prior to the start of the senior year) are encouraged to attend. Participants will be grouped according to ability and position in order to get the most out of each instructional period.

Equipment

Campers should wear comfortable clothes during all sessions. You must provide your own glove and softball shoes; you should also bring a pair of tennis shoes in case of inclement weather. If you bring your own bat, please make sure to tape your name to it. Catchers should bring their own catching gear with their name attached. We also recommend you bring a water bottle, sun block lotion, a towel, and an extra change of clothes (for water slide days).

Coach Blevins—Head Coach. Entering her 22nd season, Blevins has lead her teams to 7 Women's College World Series appearances (4 at Iowa), won 8 Big Ten titles (5 at Iowa) and has been inducted into the Indiana University and NFCA Hall of Fame.



Shane Bouman—Pitching Coach. Bouman enters his 2nd year as the Hawkeye pitching coach. He was formerly the head coach at South Dakota State for 6 years. As a pitcher, Bouman was a 4-time ASA All American. He lead 5 teams to ASA national championships.



Diane Stephenson—Assistant Coach. Stephenson begins her 1st season as an assistant coach for the Iowa Softball team in charge of hitting and catchers. She was formerly head coach at Indiana University for 15 years, taking the Hoosiers to the NCAA Tournament 2 times. Stephenson was an All American and All Big Ten catcher for the Hoosiers.
